

Glenn Myers, Sr.

Glenn Myers, Sr., a native of Toledo, Ohio, died Sunday, May 21, at Aurora, Colorado, of congestive heart failure. He was 81 years old. Glenn was known as "Monk Myers" during his participation in Waite High School's glory days of football, where he played four years of varsity, both offensive and defensive end, and was a member of three City Championship teams. "Monk" was selected All-City End for three years, and was captain of the team in 1932. He also had the honor of being selected as the top vote-getter on the first All-Ohio football team. His mother said she was surprised that he could run so fast because he was "as slow as molasses" around the house.

Mr. Myers was a graduate of the University of South Carolina, where he played on the football team coached by Don McAllister of Toledo. He retired from the Sun Oil Company in 1968, but kept active by coaching Junior League hockey teams. In 1974, he was inducted into Waite High's first Athletic Hall of Fame. He was also chosen as a member of the Toledo City League Hall of Fame in 1989. He moved to Aurora, Colorado, following the death of his wife, Virginia.

He is survived by his sons, Glenn, Jr., and Thomas of Toledo, Frank, Frederick, Robert, and Stephen of Aurora, Colorado; daughters, Jennifer Hoersten of Toledo, and Joyce and Martha of San Francisco. His sister, Geraldine, resides in Bowling Green, Ohio, and he also has 10 grandchildren, 3 great-grandchildren; and two nieces and four nephews.

A Memorial Vigil was held in Aurora Wednesday and visitation will be held Friday from 2-9 p.m. in the Eggleston-Meinert Funeral Home. Funeral Services will be conducted Saturday at 10:30 a.m. in the mortuary with interment to follow in Calvary Cemetery.
