TOLEDO LAWYER DIES SUDDENLY

A. W. Shields Collapses of Heart Disease in Downtown Office.

Alfred W. Shields, 59, attorney of 1720 Wildwood road, died suddenly Monday in the office of W. A. Cavanaugh, insurance man, 226 North Erie street.

The attorney was seated in an outer office with Irene Swiateck, stenographer, and Karl H. L. Leibold, Pilgrim road, when he gasped and slumped back in his chair, dead.

Mr. Shields is survived by his wife, Almeda.

Coroner Frank G. Kreft said death was due to heart disease.

Mr. Shields was born in Catersville, Va., and was educated in Central college and the Washington and Lee university at Lexington, Va. In 1891 he received an LL.B. degree and was admitted to the bar in Columbus, O., where he practiced until he came to Toledo in 1910. His practice was largely confined to corporation law.

Mr. Shields belonged to Toledo lodge No. 144, F. & A. M.; Toledo chapter No. 161, R. A. M.; Toledo council No. 33, R. & S. M.; Toledo Commandery No. 7, Knights Templar; Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Zenobia Shrine; the Knights of Pythias, the Anthony Wayne chapter, Ohio Society of the Sons of the American Revolution, and the Maumee River Yacht club.
